Ministry of MSME, Government of India is implementing its flagship scheme Micro & Small Enterprises - Cluster Development Programme (MSE-CDP) to enhance competitiveness, sustainability, capacity building and collective efficiency of Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs) across the country.

2. In order to make the scheme more inclusive and to meet the changing requirements of MSEs, the guidelines of MSE-CDP have been revised in 2019 and circulated among State Governments (also available at <http://www.dcsmse.gov.in/schemes/New-Guidelines.pdf>). The main two components of the scheme are setting up of Common Facility Centres (CFCs) and creation /upgradation of infrastructural facilities in the new/existing Industrial Areas & development of Flatted Factory Complexes.

3. During our recent review of the progress of MSE-CDP, I noticed that your State /UT has not been benefited by the projects of CFC/ID. I would urge you to direct the department concerned to take up the proposals for setting up of Common Facility Centres and Flatted Factory Complexes as per the scheme guidelines for the benefit of the MSEs of the State.
