#### 1. General Characteristics of the District

Bilaspur district has emerged on the map of Himachal Pradesh on 1<sup>st</sup> July, 1954. The district was formerly known as Kahlur, a princely State of British India. The Bilaspur district is situated in Satluj valley in the outer hills and Satluj river is the main river which passes through middle of the district.

# 1.1 Location & Geographical Area

The district Bilaspur bounded by Una, Hamirpur, Mandi and Solan districts. Satluj is the main river which passes through the middle of the district and divides it into almost equal parts.

# 1.2 Topography

The Bilaspur district is situated between north latitude 31° 12′ and 31° 35′ and east longitude 76°23′ and 76° 55′ in the outer hills of the Himalayas next to the Punjab plains with an estimated area of 1,167 square Kilometers and forms a part of the basin of river Satluj which flow meandering across it for about ninety kilometers.

# 1.3 Availability of Minerals

The important minerals available in the district are Bajari, Sand, Slate, and building stone etc. Besides, some quantity of sand is also available in the district with is used for construction activity. On the basis of these resources, there is some scope of setting up ventures in the line of cement, stone grit etc. in the district.

#### 1.4 Forest

Forest also plays an important role in the economy of the district. Forest occupies an area of 428 Sq. K.M. out of the total geographical area of 1,167 Sq. K.M. The major forest produce that comes from forests are in the form of bamboo, Chil, khair, kail, fir and spruce etc. The main species of trees available in the district are khair and chil.

## 1.5 Administrative set up

For Administrative purpose, the district has been divided into 4 tehsils, namely Ghumarwin, Jhanduttta, Bilaspur Sadar, Sri Naina Deviji and 2 subtehsil namely Bharari & Namhaol. There are 4 blocks in the district namely Ghumarwin, Jhanduttta, Bilaspur and Sri Naina Deviji. There are 151 panchayats in the district covering 1061 villages.

The Bilaspur district is smallest district of the State from the point of view of setting up of MSMEs. A total number of 2406 Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises have been set up in the district as on 31/08/2015.

Maximum no. of units registered with the State Industries Department up to the 31/08/2015 were in the product group of wood & wooden based furniture fellow by repairing and servicing, woolen, silk & artificial thread based clothes, metal based & leather products etc.

#### 3.6 Service Enterprises

The service industry of Solan mainly includes entertainment services, cable/DTH services, printing, binding & lamination, welding works, photocopy services, motor binding, computer repairing, cycle/motor cycle repairing, skin and hair care, book binding, shoe repairing, repair & servicing of electrical appliances, repair & servicing of refrigerators/electronics goods, repairs of agricultural implements etc.

#### 3.6.2 Potentials areas for service industry

- Repairing & servicing of Agriculture Implements
- > Repairing & servicing of two/three wheelers & heavy vehicles
- > Repairing & servicing of computers/mobiles

#### 3.7 Unregistered Sector

The data on unregister sector in Solan district was not readily available with Department of Industries, Govt. of Himachal Pradesh. However, it is informed that the unregistered MSME sector in the district, which has majority of repair & maintenance of house hold items. Repair of Computer/Electrical/Electronic related units, Beauty Parlor, Computer educations, coaching centers, health care centers, repair & maintenance of auto sector/service stations etc.

#### 3.8 Potential for New MSMEs

The potential areas for new MSME are Woolen, silk & artificial Thread based clothes, Food & food products, Wood/wooden based furniture & Ready-made garments & embroidery, wooden furniture & fixtures, paper bags, confectionery items, tyre retarding, steel furniture, parts of industrial machinery, wires and cables, paint & varnish, packaging materials, agriculture implements, general engineering workshop, milk products, cement bricks & blocks, building hardware items, rolling shutters. Cosmetics, blow moulded goods viz water Cans, Bottles, polyester staple fibers, axle shafts, rear axils, tractor & tractor parts, wheel piston etc.
