Brief Industrial Profile of District-Hapur

1. Introduction

Hapur District was recently established as a district in NCR zone of Uttar Pradesh. It has a lot of potential because of its proximity to New Delhi and Ghaziabad. After gaining district status, it has its own district magistrates. The demand for a separate Hapur district was a longstanding one since 1976, when the Ghaziabad district was carved out of Meerut. Hapur was announced as a district named 'Panchsheel Nagar' on 28 Sep 2011 by the Chief Minister Mayawati; and in the month of July 2012 Chief Minister Akhilesh changed the name to 'Hapur District'. Hapur is known as a manufacturing center for stainless steel pipes, sewing machines, and wood and paper products.

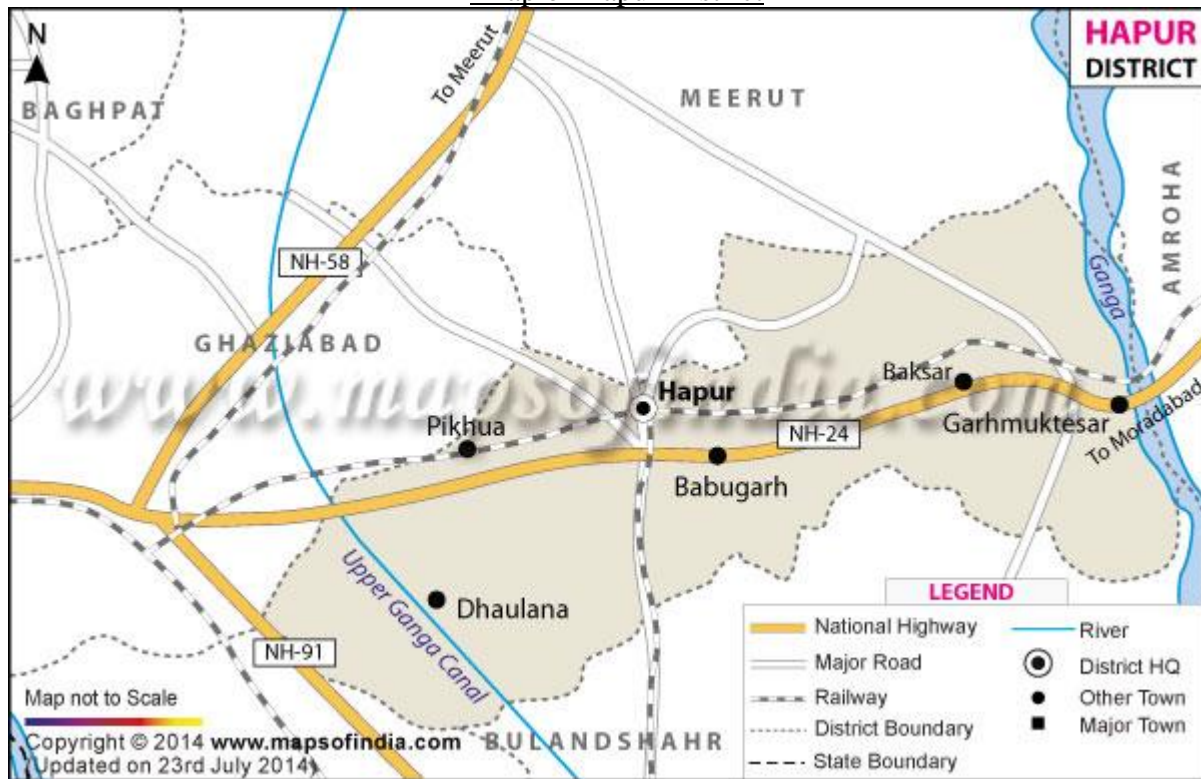
1.1.General Characteristics of the District:-

Hapur is a new district carved out from Ghaziabad district with a population of 1281272. The river Ganges forms the eastern boundary and home to the sacred place known as `Garhmukteshwar` where lakhs of people come every year for pilgrimage. Also, the river `Kali Nadi` passes from the outskirts of the city. Today Hapur is a big grain Mandi with Food Corporation of India (FCI) having its godowns as well as a processing unit in the district. Pilkhuwa, a town with a population about 1.0 lakh is very famous for its handloom works. Hapur is very famous for Potato production. There are 4 blocks namely Hapur, Garhmukteshwar, Simbhaul and Dhauluna and 3 Tehsils namely Hapur, Garhmukteshwar and Dhauluna. There are 4 Nagar Palikas and one Nagar Panchayat. There is very famous Sugar Mill in Block Simbhaul. There are 2 Private Medical College in the District Located on National Highway - 24 Namely Sarswathi Institute of Medical Sciences and Rama Medical Hospital and Research Centre. There is one private educational institute named Monad University situated on the National Highway-24 along with many private management and engineering Institutes. A unit of Century Ply Wood along with many other private ply wood factories are situated in the District. The district head quarter – Hapur is well connected by Road and Railway to Major Cities of Uttar Pradesh and India.

1.2 Location & Geographic Area with Map of District

Hapur is located at 28.72°N 77.78°E.^[2] It has an average elevation of 213 meters (699 feet). It is bound on the north by Meerut, in the south by Bulandshahr, while Ghaziabad forms the southern and western limits. Amroha District (formerly Jyotiba Phule Agar) lies to the east. It has tremendous potential because of closeness of the city to Delhi and Ghaziabad. The town was selected as a NCR region to check population migration in Delhi and was planned accordingly. Hapur also plays an important role in the education field and is famous for many institutions providing quality education.

1.3 Topography

The river Ganges forms the eastern boundary and home to the sacred place known as Garhmukteshwar where lakhs of people come every year for pilgrimage. The ground is not rocky and there are no mountains. Hapur is part of the Indus-Gangetic Plain, the soil composed of pleistocene and more recent alluvial sediments transported and deposited by river action from the Himalayan region. These alluvial deposits are unconsolidated. Lithologically, sediments consist of clay, silt and fine to coarse sand. Land is very fertile for growing crops especially for wheat, sugarcane and vegetables. The river kali nadi passes from the outskirts of the city.

Weaving is a traditional handicraft to a large part of the rural sector of the Hapur. Pilkhuwa is a concentrated place for weaving products. For people of Pilkhuwa area, it is a house hold industry. Due to weaving culture People of the area have the habitual skill to make their own clothes, of course, mostly by traditional methods. Khes, bed sheets, towels, durries/ lohi, tarpaulin etc. are manufactured. There is good demand of the items in the market. Keeping this in view spade work is being made to start a cluster on Handloom related industry
