## **Brief Industrial Profile of Mahendergarh District**

### **1.General Characteristics of the District**

Mahendergarh district was formed in 1948 by grouping different tracts of erstwhile princely states; Narnaul and Mahendergarh tehsils from Patiala State, Dadri (Charkhi Dadri) from Jind State and a part of Bawal nizamat from Nabha State. It became a part of Patiala and East Punjab States Union(PEPSU) state. On November 1, 1956, with the merger of PEPSU with Punjab, it became a part of Punjab state and with the formation of Haryana state in 1966, it became a part of the newly formed state. Rewari tehsil of Gurgaon district was added to it in 1972 but Rewari tehsil was made a separate district in 1989. Mahendragarh was earlier known as 'Kanaud' because of its association with Kanaudia group of Brahmans<sup>1</sup>. During the middle of the nineteenth century, it came to be known as Mahendergarh. How it was known in earlier periods is not known. Possibly it may have formed a part of the Kurujangala, a territorial designation known to traditional literature.

Although the nomenclature of the district is not very old, the antiquity of the area it covered can be stretched to earlier periods also. The Archaeological explorations conducted in the region have brought to light late- Harappan sites specially from its Rewari tahsil<sup>3</sup>. This type of evidence along with Painted Grey Ware, Northern Black Polished Ware and Early Historical Ware is gathered from the adjoining districts of Bhiwani and Gurgaon<sup>4</sup>. In the absence of archaeological excavations in the district nothing more can be added to what has been stated above. So far not a single PGW site has come to light in the district, perhaps suggesting the north-eastward migrations of the Aryans from the banks of the Saraswati and the Drisadvati possibly due to the drying up of their courses. Most of the sites explored in the district belong to the late-medieval period. The district, it may further be pointed out, might possibly have remained outside the main stream of Aryan culture and hence has not been specifically mentioned in the traditional literature as an independent territorial unit. In the absence of evidence it also becomes extremely difficult to trace the successive stages in the historical growth of the

region. However, it has been suggested that some of the present streams of the district may be identified with those mentioned in early Vedic literature.

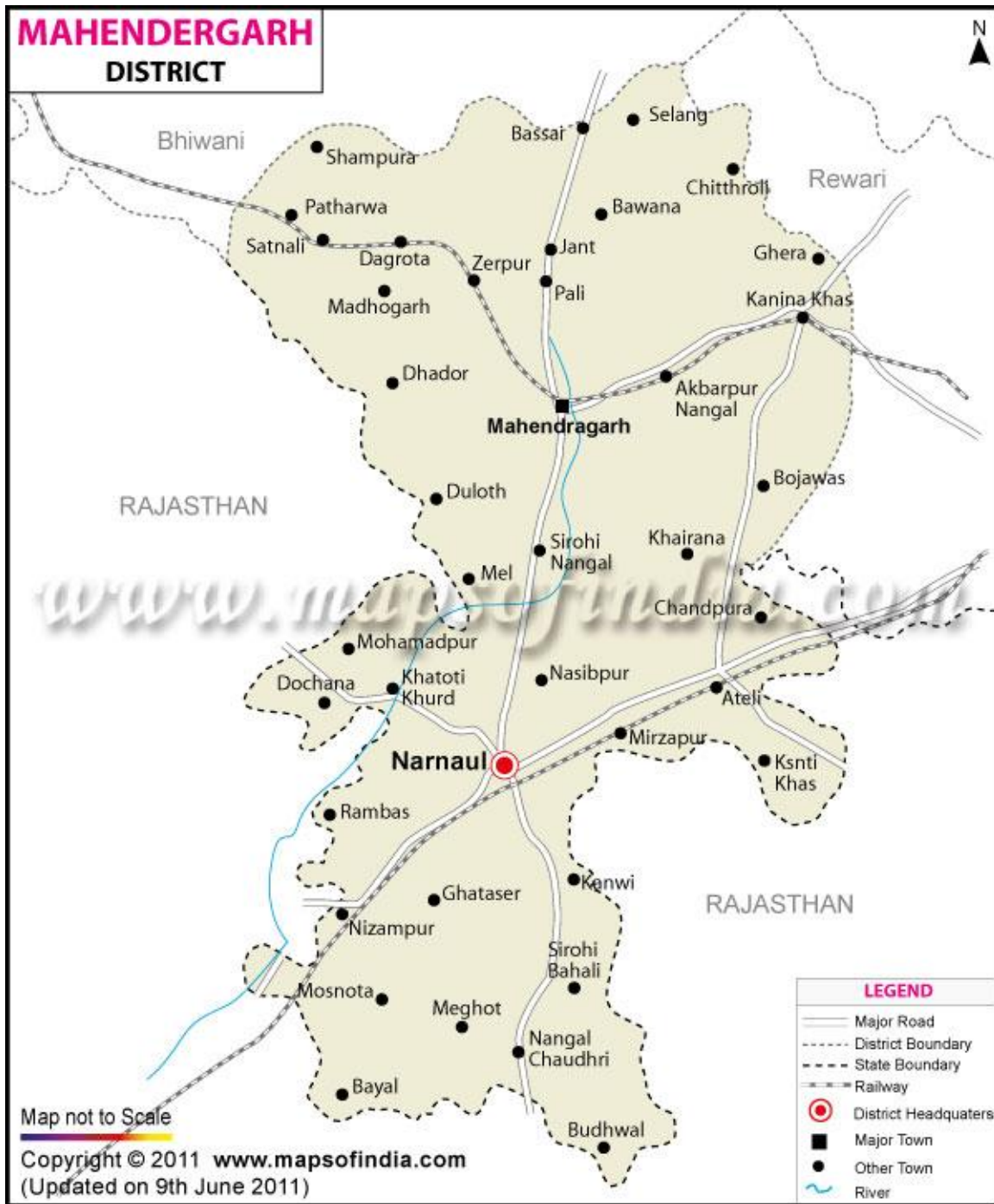
### **1.1 Location & Geographical Area.**

The district lies between north latitude 27° 47' to 28° 26' and east longitude 75° 56' to 76° 51'. It is bounded on the north by Bhiwani and Rohtak districts, on the east by Rewari district and Alwar district of Rajasthan, on the south by Alwar, Jaipur and Sikar districts of Rajasthan, and on the west by Sikar and Jhunjhunu districts of Rajasthan.

### **1.2 Topography**

The district abounds in sand dunes and bare low hills of the great Aravalli range are scattered and these bare rounded formations illustrate the phenomenon of desert erosion. Tals and tibbas of the district present a desert look. The menace of advancing deserts adds complexity to the situation and poses difficulty in the extension and implementation of irrigation plans bearing heavy costs. The xerophytic type of flora dominates in the district. The district is inadequately wooded and some parts are practically bare of trees. Tree species found are khairi, jand, pahari khar, khar, dhok, babool, rohera, janti or reru, jai or van, beri, barh, pipal, lasura, imli, barna, shisham, siris, neem, farash, henna, papri, gular, indokh, tut, gulmohar, simbal or samul, kandu, bakain, safeda, arind and dhak. Khar or pahari khar is found all over the district. Farash is common in Rewari tahsil.

Shrubs found in the district are pala, hins, Puthkanda, bansa, panwar, karia, khip, Aak, phog and Nagphani. Amarbel is a common parasite climber. One of the most characteristic shrubs is pala, a prickly shrub, which covers the fields thickly during September and October. It is very useful shrub; its leaves are used as fodder; its fruits are eaten; its thorny bushes are used for hedges or as fuel and its roots for dyeing leather. Nagphani forms thick hedge round many villages in tahsil.



### 1.3 Availability of minerals.

Mahendergarh district has rich mineral deposits. It enjoys unique position in the state but it is irony of the fate that these deposits have not been tapped to the desired extent and add negligible contribution to the district economy. The important minerals found in the district are lime stone, marble, sandstone, iron or silica sand, feldspar quartz, calcite.

## 1.4 Forests

The district has practically no forest. Except growth keekar, jandi , maskets thornily shrubs on the waste lands and farms. The forest department has drawn up a scheme names Aravelli project which act as a natural barrier checking the advance of the deserts towards esteren rajsthan and indo genetic plain. The objective is to provide environmental protection through restoration of green cover of village, common lands in Aravalli hills and to improve the income and living conditions of people by meeting there requirements of fuel, fodder and timber in echological manner. Presently district has 57 Sq kms. of land under forest constituting 1.03% of the total geographical area.

## 1.5 Administrative set up.

For administrative purpose Mahendragarh district is divided in to 5 tehsils, Mahendragarh, Narnaul, Nangal Chowdhary, Ateli and Kanina. and 1 sub-tehsil namely, Satnali. Mahendragarh tehsil divided in to 8 blocks: Ateli Nangal, Kanina, Mahendragarh, Nangal Choudhary, Narnaul, Sihma, Nizampur and Satnali .
