Bageshwar District is a district of [Uttarakhand](#) state in northern [India](#). The town of [Bageshwar](#) is the district headquarters. The District of Bageshwar came into existence on 15th September, 1997. It borders Chamoli in the North, Pithoragarh in the East, and Almora in the South-West. Bageshwar the land of Lord Shankar is of great religious, historic and political significance. The Nilaparvat, situated between the rivers Saryu and Gomati is said to be inhabited by all the 33 crore Gods of the Hindu pantheon. The share of culturable-based land is 6.8% in Uttarakhand that provides a huge potential for plantation crops like Jeotropa and other species of Tree Borne Oilseeds (TBOS) and also for horticulture crops in the State. As per census of 2011 it is the third least populous district of Uttarakhand out of 13 District after Rudraprayag and Champawat.

1.1 Location & Geographical Area of District –Bageshwar



The district of Bageshwar is located in the northern parts of province of Uttaranchal in India. In east lies the district of Pithoragarh bordering Tibet and it's west lies the district of Chamoli and it's North lie the the Great Himalayas and in the South there is the district Bageshwar. Situated at the confluence of rivers Saryu, Gomti and latent Bhagirathi, lies the holy township of Bageshwar; also revered as the pious land associated with Lord Sadashiva, the redeemer of all sins. As the puranas state, this undoubtedly is a place capable of liberating one from the eternal bondage of births & deaths. With the east and west flanked by the Bhileswar and Nileshtar mountains and surrounded by Suraj Kund in the north and Agni Kund in the south, this land of Lord Shankar is of great religious, historic and political significance.

1.3 Agriculture:

Department of Agriculture was set up in 1875. Initially, the Department of Agriculture was limited only to compiling statistics and to establish model form. In 1880, it was attached to the Department of Land Records. After implementation of Govt. of India Act 1919 and as a result in order to establish State Agriculture Policy, the Agriculture Department came into existence on 01.12.1919. After Uttarakhand State came into existence in the year 2000, Uttarakhand Govt. had notified the restructuring of the Agriculture Department on 02.08.2003.

1.4 Horticulture

Uttarakhand is known for its horticultural crops, which include fruits, vegetables, off-season vegetables, floricultural crops, medicinal and aromatic plants. Horticulture is one of critical sectors in the economy of the hill state of Uttarakhand. It provides much needed opportunity for diversification and increased employment in the state where the scope of high rate of growth in conventional agriculture is rather limited due to peculiar topography and majority of scattered and marginal holdings. Uttarakhand shared 2.81 per cent of all India area under fruits.

1.5 Forests:

The mixed temperate coniferous forests in this region are primarily the broad-leaved species of mixed banj oak and its associates including rhododendron and other Quercus species. On the lower elevations, particularly on south-facing ridges, are the dry temperate forests dominated by the chir pine forests. Ecological changes in these sanctified forests, primarily the mixed banj oak forests, have resulted in enormous forest regeneration. This regeneration can be characterized by the rejuvenation of the overstorey, particularly the increase in crown density, changes in the maturity-class structure due to the emergence of new oak and associated trees, changes in composition of forest vegetation in some forests resulting from the excessive regeneration of specific shrub species, and changes in discharge of water sources, as well as abundance of forest fauna. Some sanctified forests in the region are also in effect being preserved rather than conserved, leading to unexpected changes in the emerging floral compositions, particularly the overgrowth of Berberis shrub species, inhibiting the regeneration of oak species in sanctified forests.

1.6 Administrative set up.

The District magistrate is the overall head of the district. For the administrative work District Magistrate is supported by team of officers, such as for law & order by Senior Supdt. of Police(SSP),for development works by Chief Development Officer(CDO) for revenue administration Addl. District Magistrates ,SDMs , for forest related work by DFO etc.

The other activities of District Magistrate office includes issuing & cancellation of arm licenses, keeping records of Nazul land , Stamps , registry work , redressal of court cases related to lands . Being the head of district a common man puts ones grievances before collector which are generally related to different departments , one section of District Collector office looks after these public complaints and traces there answers from the concerned departments/officers.
