## **Brief Industrial Profile of Kishtwar District**

### **1. General Characteristics of the District**

District Kishtwar has been carved out in the year 2007 and it started functioning as independent administrative unit on 01-04-2007. Kishtwar town is the HQ of District Kishtwar situated at a distance of 235 kms from the winter capital of Jammu and Kashmir State. It is located between 35-55 and 45-97 degrees longitudinal; however the altitude of the District varies from 3000-15000 ft. above the sea level. Commonly known as the 'Land of Sapphire and Saffron', it is also very rich in forest products. Kishtwar is surrounded by the District Anantnag, District Doda and also touches the boundaries of state Himachal Pradesh. Kishtwar District is a newly formed district of Jammu and Kashmir. As of 2011 it is the third least populous district of Jammu and Kashmir (out of 22), after Kargil and Leh. The District has derived its name from "Kishat Rishi" who stayed here. It is the modified version of earlier name of Kishaswar. Kishtwar in its ancient form Kashthavata, is first referred to in the Rajatarangini during the empire of Raja Kalsa of Kashmir, when "Uttamaraja", the ruler of Kashthavata visited the court of Kashmiri king in company with several other hill chiefs to pay their respects to the Raja. Kishtwar is surrounded by the mighty Himalayas from all the sides, kindling off in Marwah-Warwan valley, Paddar valley and Chhatroo valley. Kishtwar endowed with dense forests of deodar, fir and pine is treasure of scenic beauty. There are high altitude mountains ranging between 20,000 feet to 21,000 feet like Num Kum, Burmah and Barnag. It offers tremendous scope for pilgrim tourism also as some important shrines are located in the area. These include Ziarat Zain-Shah-Sahib, Farid-ud-Din Sahib, Hazrat Asrar-ud-Din Sahib, Athara Bhuja Devi temple, Chandi Mata temple and Hatta Wali Mata. Kishtwar merged with the State of Jammu and Kashmir in 1821, A.D. With the passage of time Kishtwar became a Tehsil of District Udhampur and remained its part till 1948, when it became part of newly created District Doda in the wake of first re-organization of the state during the post-independence period.

## 1.1 Location & Geographical Area.

Kishtwar is bounded on the north by Kashmir and Zaskar Valleys, on the south by Bhaderwah and Doda Tehsils, on the east by Himachal Pradesh and on the west by Anantnag and Ramban Districts. Kishtwar district branches off in three valleys of Marwa, Warwan, Padder and Chatru with their terminal at Kishtwar town. There is no other vehicular road link to these valleys except from the Kishtwar terminal. The Gateway to Dachhan is Ekhala and Hanzel to Marwa Warwan Valley whereas Lidrari is Gateway to Padder valley and Dadpath Chatru Valley.

## 1.2 Topography

**Kishtwar** is a municipality in the Kishtwar District of the Jammu region in J&K. As the seat of district administration, it houses governmental offices including the Deputy Commissioner, Additional Deputy Commissioner, Assistant Commissioner Revenue, Chief Medical Officer, Chief Education officer, Chief Horticulture Officer, Chief Agriculture officer, Sheep Husbandry, Chief Animal Husbandry officer, DFO, ACD, Executive Engineer (Xen) PWD, Xen PDD, Xen PHE, GM NHPC, GM CVPP and other district officers. The town is the only municipality of the district and center of business and learning in the district. The town has been seat of historic kingdom of Kishtwar and has faced many great Indian military campaigns including that of Mughals. The king of Kishtwar was the subsidiary of Kashmir Kingdom and owe its cultural and linguistic similarity to the Kashmir valley. The natives also speak a distinct language related to this



area only and has been named as Kishtwar. Being a part of Dogra kingdom certain customs and words of Dogri have also been incorporated in the native language.

The Chenab River flows through the district and is joined by tributaries such as Marvisudar river of Mawah, Fambar Nallah, Chingam Nallah which meet at the confluence near Bhandarkoot. The rivers have given a unique look to the area with steep gorges and wide plains on the way. Padder Tehsil has breathtaking mountain landscape which are a treat to the eyes of travellers. Warwan valley and Marwah valleys are unique in being located in the way of river Marusudhar giving a mesmerizing look to the area. The area is also famous for its high mountain passes which have been the mountaineers delight since British era. Many illustrations are found in the travelogue written by British writers including Otto Rothfields With pen and Rifle in Kashmir. The Kishtwar Anantnag National Highway passes through the famous Synthan Pass and Daksum Nowpachi Road passes through the Margan top a 13 km long and 5100m high pass. The Steep Brahma mountain peak is situated at Dachhan which is documented by British mountaineers. The warwan Valley has been rated among India's top ten trekking destination with a wide range of landscape. Saffron of purest quality is produced in the iron rich soil at Pochhal, Matta, Lachdayaram and Hidyul. Kishtwar National Park, in the northeast region of the district, has a large number of peaks and glaciers. The town has a small Air Landing ground under the control and management of Indian Army which cater to civil and military Helicopter

## 1.4 FOREST

Kishtwar Forest Division came into existence in the year 1906 AD after bifurcation of Udhampur Forest Division. In 1924 AD Kishtwar Forest Division was split to form Ramban Forest Division, and operated under administrative control of Udhampur Forest Circle. After the split, the division comprised of five Ranges namely Paddar, Nagseni, Dachhan, Marwah and Kishtwar. In the year 1982 AD as a part of reorganization two ranges Dachhan and Marwah were separated to be included in newly created Division by name Marwah Forest Division. Kishtwar Division now consists of three territorial ranges viz; Kishtwar, Nagseni and Paddar and one non territorial overlapping range of Soil Conservation. The area of Kishtwar Forest Division falls in the civil jurisdiction of Kishtwar District which includes within it the tehsils of Kishtwar.

## 1.5 Administrative set up.

The district has 13 blocks which are further divided into 134 Gram panchayats the total village in the districts are 156 out of which are 155 are in-habitated and 01 are Un-inhabitated. The block wise details are as under:-
