Brief Industrial Profile of Cachar District.

1. GENERAL CHARACTERISTIC OF THE DISTRICT

The District is located in the Barak Valley region of south Assam in the North East Region of India. The land is characterized by wide arrays of hilly terrains in the north, viz. Borail Hills, and in the south, the Mizoram Hills, plain lands and rivers. Hills in the borders and Valleys are two prominent identities of the district.

1.1 LOCATION & GEOGRAPHICAL AREA

The District of Cachar is bounded by the Borail Hills in the north, the state of Manipur in the east and Mizoram in the south, and Meghalaya & districts of Hailakandi and Karimganj and also part of Bangladesh in the west. The area falls in latitude 24.22 - 25.8 N and longitude 92.29 - 93.15 E. Total Geographical area of the district is 378600 Hectre.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY

District's topography shows the positional features of the district, showing its border with various states and districts located in the North East part of India. The prime geographical character that forms the topographical features of Cachar, a part of the Barak Valley, is the river Barak. The river spreads its rich alluvial plains across the length and breadth of three southernmost districts of Assam.

The agricultural fields of the district are specially blessed by the river. Being divided into several rivulets and streams, the river as a whole makes the land suitable for agricultural production. Adding the alluvial soil, river directly helps in increasing the crop growth.

The topography of the district also featured through many quaint hills that exist. In fact some of the hills like Mizoram, Jaintia and Borail of adjoining states/district act as boundary indicators. As a whole, the district's topography resembles the varied landscape characteristics of the state.

1.3 AVAILABILITY OF MINERALS

1.4 FOREST

The district of Cachar having a total forest cover of 55856 Hectares. The Forest comprises of 34199 Hectares of Reserve forest and 14270 Hectares of proposed reserved forest and 7387 hectares of protected area. The total forest area does not include unclassified State Forest.

1.5 ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP

Head of Administration of the District is the Deputy Commissioner (DC), appointed by State Government. DC also acts as the Collector in case of Revenue matters, as District Magistrate in case of maintenance of law & order, as District Election Officer in case of conduct of an Election, and so on.

The District Commissioner is having in his office Additional District Commissioners, Extra Assistant Commissioner, and others to assist.

The District is composed of Sub-Divisions headed Sub Divisional Officer and several Circles (composed of a number of villages and town) headed by a Circle Officer. A Village has nominal appointed head called the Gaonbura. Towns have elected or persons appointed by State/District Administration.
