Brief Industrial Profile of Meerut District

1. General Characteristics of the District

Meerut is having prestigious space in the Indian history. The first revolution for freedom of India was started here itself in 1857 by great son of this soil Mangal Pandey. Capital of Kauravs & Pandavas was at Hastinapur And Capital of King Parichit was at Parichitgarh, both the places fall in the district of Meerut. Fair of Nauchandi is having very historic as well as cultural importance in the northern part of the country, persons comes here for joy & business from all over the country. This district is also famous for its sports goods industries world over.

1.1 Location & Geographical Area.

Meerut is 65 km away from the national capital of India and falls under the National Capital Territory. The Meerut district is located between 77°. 00' & 78°. 00' longitude East and 28°. 54' & 29°. 15' latitude North. The district is bounded on the north by Muzaffarnagar district, on the South by Ghaziabad, Bulandsahar & Gautambudh Nagar districts and on the East by Bijnore & Jyotibaphule Nagar districts and on the West by Baghpat district. The whole district is a vast level plain. Ganga & Hindon Rivers draws the Eastern & Western boundaries of the district.

1.2 Topography

From the point of view of health the climate of Meerut is very good. Specially from November to March months the climate of the district is very pleasant due to western-northern airflow. Here summer starts very early. The temperature of the district is varies from 2° C in winter to 46° C in summer. The wet session normally starts in the end of June month. The average rainfall is 586 mm; the winter months are virtually dry.

1.3 Availability of Minerals.

No mineral is available in the district.

1.4 FOREST

The total forest area in the district is 21,314 hectare.

1.5 Administrative set up.

Meerut city is the Divisional headquarter of Uttar Pradesh. For administrative convenience, the district of Meerut has been divided into three tehsils namely,

- 1. Sardhana
- 2. Mawana
- 3. Meerut

These tehsils are further divided into 12 blocks.
