1. General Characteristics of the District

In ancient days, modern Saran division formed a part of Kosala country . The historical background of the district - as available in the 'Ain-E-Akbari' records Saran is one of the six sarkars (Revenue Divisions) constituting the province of Bihar. It is one of the thirty eight district of Bihar.

1.1 Location & Geographical Area.

- SARAN is located at 25°36' -26°13'N latitude&84°24' - 85°15'E longitude. It has an av1erage elevation of 36 metres (118 feet).

- CHHAPRA district came in existence in 1972, initially it was a part of TIRHUT DIVISION . The Ganges constitute the southern boundary of the district, beyond which lie the district of Bhojpur and Patna. To the north of Saran lies the district of Siwan and Gopalganj. The Gandak forms the dividing line with the Vaishali and Muzaffarpur district in the east.To the west of Saran lies the district of siwan and the district of Ballia in Uttar Pradesh., the Ghaghra constituting the a natural boundary between Saran and Ballia .

1.2 Topography



The district is shaped like a triangle ; its apex is at the confluence of the boundary of the district and the Gandak- Ganges river. There are three from south, northeast and southern and western

side respectively. The district is mainly made up of entirely of plains, but several depression and marshes create three broad division.

1. The alluvial plains along the big rivers
2. The region of uplands away from river, not subject to floods.
3. The diara area in the beds of the great rivers.
